- Mark discussed the use of Replica data and how it might be utilized as a supplement to freight data and assist with validation of the RTDM. John is interested in exploring Replica in more detail to assess its value.. He believes that Replica would provide us with free data for testing.
- Taegy believes the Replica data is like Streetlight and other data sets the NCDOT has access to. He had no objection to learning more.
